District Administrator Gerhardt Hubner to Leave Position

The South San Luis Obispo County Sanitation District (SSLOCSO) and District Administrator Gerhardt Hubner announce that Mr. Hubner will leave his position effective August 3, 2017. Following the completion of several District initiatives, the District and Mr. Hubner agree that this is a good time for a transition.

According to Mr. Hubner:

I am very proud to have accomplished many of the goals and objectives I set out to complete since coming to the District over a year ago, including:

- Settlement of the 2010 Litigation with the Regional Water Quality Control Board, and the allocation of over \$500,000 to local and regional projects in the community;
- Memorandum of Agreement with the City of Pismo Beach for a joint Environmental Impact Report to support the Regional Groundwater Sustainability Project, and promote future recycled water for the south San Luis Obispo County area; and
- Unanimous Approval by the California Coastal Commission of a 30-year Coastal Development Permit to allow and support the construction of important secondary treatment plant infrastructure that will protect public safety and coastal resources now and into the future.

Mr. Hubner will work with an interim administrator to be appointed by the District Board of Directors to ensure a smooth transition.

John Shoals, Chair of the District's Board of Directors, said "the District appreciates Mr. Hubner's time, energy and insights as the District's first fulltime Administrator, and wishes him well in his future pursuits."

By the terms of his separation agreement with the District, Mr. Hubner will receive three months of severance pay and will waive and release any and all claims against the District.
